

Opening of the Polish Hill River Church Museum

October 9, 1988, is an important date for us. On this day, the Polish Hill River Church Museum was officially opened in the former schoolhouse of the first settlers, restored through the efforts of the Adelaide Polish community.

The three small rooms once served as a schoolhouse, a sacristy, and one of the rooms was a residence.

In each of these rooms, we set up exhibitions.

The first room houses memorabilia of the pioneers, mainly enlarged photographs.

The second room displays documents.

The third room, titled "Memorabilia from Poland," features historical paintings, a Christmas-themed collection, and publications about Polish settlement in this area.

It is also worth noting that the second exhibition was arranged by M. Wolański, and the third by T. Murawski.
